Like many college students studying Greek, I frequently studied the language with charts. The one I used corresponded to Bill Mounce's basic Greek textbook, and it served me well. When I found out that there was going to be a laminated chart that corresponded to the book, *Going Deeper With New Testament Greek*, by Andreas Kostenberger, Benjamin Merkle, and Robert Plummer, I was intrigued, but a little skeptical about how useful it might be. Whereas basic Greek involves a lot of memorization of rules, what is great about intermediate Greek is that it tends to focus more on biblical exegesis--which is a lot more enjoyable. Therefore, I was not sure how practical it would be

to have charts for intermediate Greek. Alas, I was pleasantly surprised by this new resource. When I think of Greek charts, I have parsing rules that come to mind (and like a good reader of Bill Mounce's Basics of Biblical Greek, almost everything revolves around the $\tilde{\alpha}$ $\hat{\alpha}$ α α ... $\tilde{\alpha}$ $\hat{\alpha}$ α ...hey, it helps). The charts for Going Deeper With New Testament Greek, however, are better defined as "lists." There are charts/lists for textual criticism, different cases, the use of articles, adjectives, voices, moods, verbs, participles, infinitives, pronouns, prepositional phrases, conjunctions, and word studies. In total, there are 6 pages, but it folds together in the size of one large page. I can really see how this resource can be helpful for pastors and teachers who are studying a passage to preach or teach. It can easily be kept at a desk or bookshelf (it's very thin) so that, when reading through a passage, the interpreter can easily consult a particular chart when stumped (or just verifying the meaning). For those that own the hard-copy, full length textbook, I do think having these charts can be helpful. It doesn't add any new material, but should be thought of as a resource most applicable for quick referencing or to practice memorizing. I think it will be handy to me as I study the New Testament, and will continue to put it to good use.***Special thanks to B&H Publishing for providing this resource as a review copy. The authors' books separately are a must-have also - if you want to really study.

I just purchased this laminated study help last week and am really impressed with it. The authors have managed to fit approximately 220 syntactical subcategories onto the sheet (which folds up and easily fits in a three ringed binder). The guide is well organized, clean, and really easy to read and navigate through. The charts are formatted with the use of different colors, fonts, and text sizes for each category title, making it easy to skim through all the information when you're searching for something specific. Plus, instead of using a white background, the charts are printed over a sand color, which helps soften the contrast and strain on your eyes when studying for long periods (it's funny how that actually DOES matter). Each syntactical example is illustrated with a bible verse, and then the English translation is listed right next to it, so you can understand how the Greek grammar is functioning without having to turn anywhere. Well worth the buy. The textbook is really impressive too. It has extensive study charts at the end of each chapter and an entire chapter dedicated to explaining diagramming and discourse analysis, and includes lists of other websites and resources

in the field. I've read through four or five Greek grammars. I think this combo (book and chart) is the most comprehensive and user friendly.

This is a summary sheet for the book. It has six pages (3 sturdy sheets) that folds to 8 1/2 by 11 inches. It has good font sizes for the categories (nominative etc. .) and grammatical function (subject etc. .). It is easy to find what you are looking for whether a verb or noun and whether it is aorist tense or genitive. It has a good background color.(I think cream) that makes it easier to read and use. It is a summary (not like the summaries in the book) that covers chapters 1-12 and 14. Each grammatical function has a concise but good explanation (or example verse). The functions are in bold faced font and also the key words in the illustrative verses.I can see its usefulness in the classroom (for in class work and for tests) for different Greek related classes. It can also be used for review and study in between classes and even at home.But the price of \$6.99 may be quite high (for me) for a student who may need to buy several textbooks for classes. So unless it is required it may not be a priority for purchase. Also, the size makes it not convenient to carry around when you have a book or Bible with you while are at church or in the park. I think it would have been good if the size fits the UBS or Nestle Aland Greek NT. This size would make it easier to carry it as an insert in the Greek NT that would be helpful to use while listening to a sermon (it helps to practice your Greek) or in the doctor's office.I also think it might be better to make it part of the Going Deeper book as insert that still fits a Greek NT. Maybe make the price of the book and insert together as \$54.99. The font size and number of pages have to change.I am giving it 3 stars because of the price and the size. If the price and size do not bother you, then it is a good resource to have. If quality of content is the only concern, then this is helpful.I received this chart for free from B & H to review it here and elsewhere.
