

He hungrily devoured every volcano documentary available on Netflix (over and over), and a friend recommended this book. Since its arrival in February, we have never even put this book away. Both of my sons can very nearly recite it, and they love to pore over the gorgeous, exciting pictures that are on every page. We read it every single day. It's a great, great book for curious kids!

This book not only provides beautiful photographs, but good comprehensive information too. The material is accessible and thorough and is enhanced by the stunning photography. If you're looking

for basic information, this is a great resource.

I got this for my 7 year old for his birthday along with The Ultimate Volcano Science Kit - Make It Erupt!. He really enjoyed it, and there is a lot of great info for young scientists. There's info about volcanoes around the world, how they work, and a bit of history to go along with it. Some of the pictures are a little dated, but they kept his attention and my 3 year olds also had fun reading with us.

My grandson is at the volcano stage. He eats, breathes, and yes, outpours lava lumps. Buy hey, if he can now hear eruptions that are taking place 4000 miles away, I figure, he's got a great future on some reality show where surviving a sudden eruption is a true-to-life high stakes game. What's not to like about a product that stimulates a four year old to the point of absolute obsession. I could say more, but have to run... got a pahoe-hoe flow on my heels.

These Seymour Simon (Smithsonian) books are a joke. \$7 dollars for a book that is thinner than most magazines. Ridiculous, you're paying for the Smithsonian name only. I bought a few of these books at the same time and I have regretted wasting my money since they have come in. The people who give good reviews are either too easily impressed or just don't know what a good book is. Buyer Beware!

My 7 year old son is obsessed with Volcano's so I purchased this for him for Christmas. It is one of his favorite books and he is able to follow along and I caught him reading along with it. He is on the autism spectrum and has some issues with reading so I was worried if he would be able to read this book or if it would be too old for him but he has no problem reading it and is in love with it.

My son loves this book. The photos are fantastic. The content, if you read the whole thing, is a bit too advanced for him (3 years), but I think this book will be one he will enjoy for years to come. Lots of information about volcanoes on a kids level.

This book tells some myths about the volcano gods and then goes into volcano science. It shows many different kinds of volcanoes, including cinder cones, strato volcanoes, dome volcanoes, and shield volcanoes. The book explains it all really well. There are some big, some little photographs, and they are all clear and interesting. No parts of this book are too scary for kids, but some kids

might not want to read it. And that's ok. I'm a kid with an interest in geology. This book is not boring.
