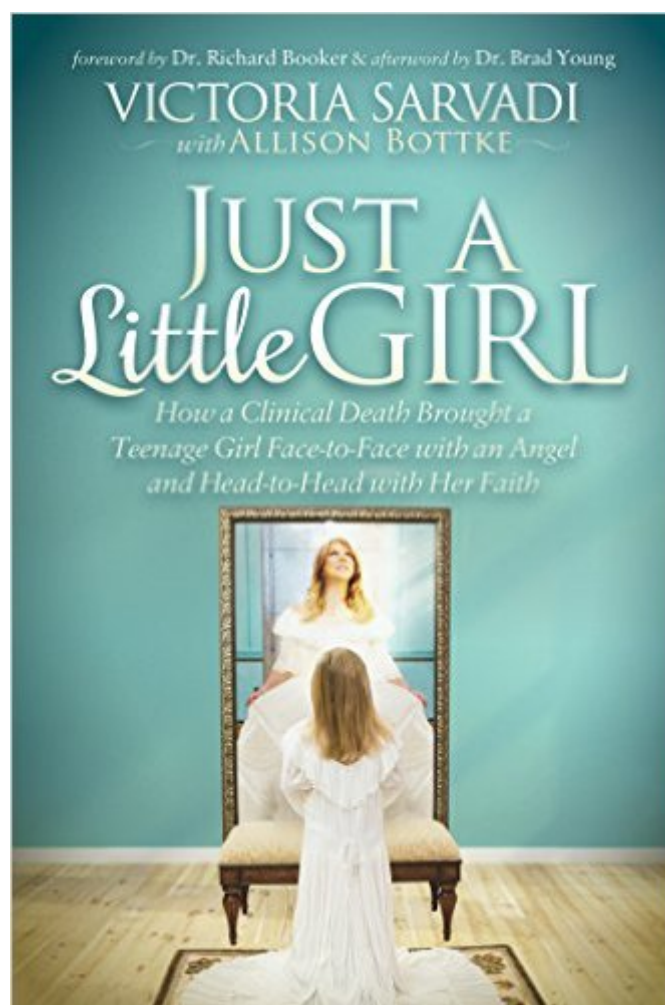

Nobody asked me to give her a character reference, but I'm happy to be able to report that both Dr. Sarvadi and her husband, Paul, are highly respected by the people here who know them. In my opinion, she and Allison Bottke have done an excellent job of capturing the real Victoria Sarvadi.

I received the manuscript of this book to read before it was published and believe me, I could not put it down. Tears filled my eyes as I read about her amazing life experiences and how she was transformed and reformed by a deep desire for truth. After reading my pre-publication copy of Just A Little Girl by Dr. Victoria Sarvadi I have considered the impact this book may have on any open-minded reader. First of all, if the reader is a pure materialist then this book will so challenge her assumptions about reality that it will require making a conscious decision to suspend prejudice temporarily in order to sift through the evidentiary nature of

the rare experience contained in the narrative of this remarkable life. But for the reader who approaches the story with simple openness, the events of Victoria's life along with what they mean to her will have the fortuitous effect of illuminating many difficult human issues for the reader. Every time I have known of a person who has clinically died and had a conscious experience while in the clinical-death or near-death state, that person has emerged (once resuscitated or brought back to normative consciousness) with a radically transformed view of life and with a redirected sense of purpose. So it is with Dr. Sarvadi. Her life has been radically devoted to a pursuit of truth for the purpose of helping others who struggle to understand life and its purpose. Here is a story that reads like a novel (she has personally participated in the major denominations of historic Christianity from Catholicism to Reformation to Evangelical-Charismatic to Hebraic) as well as that reads like a psychological and spiritual chronolog. The story revolves around a real woman who has lived a very large real life but who has also dug into that life in order to extract from it the essences that make life Life.
