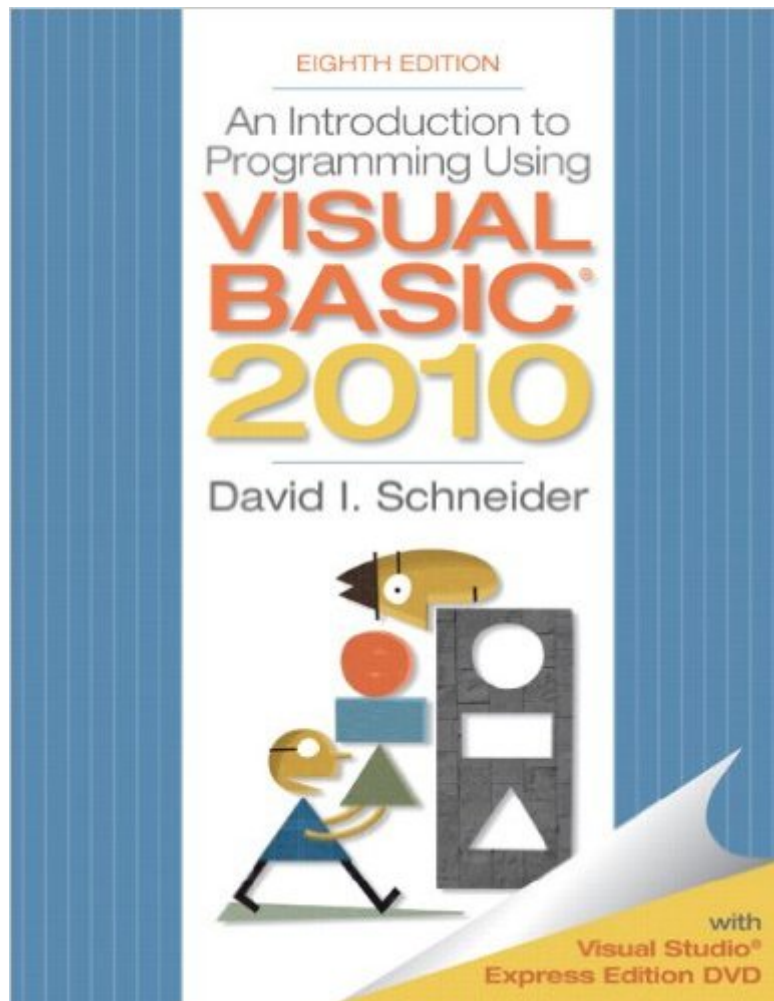

I had to get this book for a class and it is an ok text book. I like that it comes with a copy of the visual basic software editor so that you can load it at home and don't have to go to a school lab everytime you need to work on homework. The only real negative I have with the book is that if you know NOTHING about any programming language (me) it is a little hard to use I have to do a little extra reading from other texts to keep up.

This book is vastly overpriced. The material is not organized nor indexed well. A given subject is dragged through a number of sections instead of giving a thorough explanation and moving on. I am a math instructor. I found the book both boring and unpleasant to use. It might be great for an instructor who only wants to roll out the Pearson prepared materials but his students will be unable to really produce much without outside resources. The student exercises seemed to be wasteful of

space. The projects were rather fussy and contrived. I will say I did not spot too many bad errors of fact. For a beginner I would recommend a Sams 24 Hour, A For Dummies or similar book. It will save you \$70 to \$90.'s price saved me at least \$20 on this text over the campus bookstore.

This is an Updated version of a text I had in College. I wanted to update the old college library I have had for about 10 years and bring it up to newer software that would be both "Cheap" and for newer software that was affordable. Visual Studio 2013 books were still in the new price area so I went with the 2010 set that Microsoft still gives the Express version away.

This is one of the clearest manuals I have ever seen in 30 years. Concepts are explained clearly, the exercises are pertinent, and the experience of learning Visual Basic was a complete joy. This book should be used by other publishers as a guide for what a manual should look and feel like. I highly recommend this item if you want to learn Visual Basic the easy way.

If you have no knowledge of VB and are not a programmer...then you might wanna read another book. I had to buy Murach's Visual Basic 2012 to understand this book. And the video that is provided with this book (from the school website) the guy sounds like he has a nasal drip problem....or something. And as is about as exciting to watch the video as is reading the book....considering the subject matter. Book arrived on time and brand new...Kudos !

I used this book for my programming class this last semester and learned a lot! I liked the presentation and layout of the book. The sections flow into each other nicely and help you grasp the concepts one by one. The examples that are provided are also good. There are online video notes (if you have the code) that go into further detail about each section and are really useful. The book does everything it can to be helpful to new computer users, but if you don't already possess a certain level of computer skill, you might get lost or confused along the way. All in all, a great book and would recommend it to anyone looking to learn programming!

If you know absolutely nothing about computers and would like to learn to program, this book is written specifically for you. Although, you might want to learn some other things about computers before taking on Visual Basic, such as how to turn one on, or how to open up the word processor. This book contains pages of human executable code that will turn you into a machine that creates exciting applications in VB.net that will, for example, compute your resting heart rate, so that you

might be able to determine if you are still alive after suffering through the exercise.

I had to take a programming class as part of my mathematics education major. I had no previous experience with coding, and I took the class online, so there was no professor next to me to help if I needed it. For the most part, this book has great explanations on how to use Visual Basic so I could figure out what I was doing for my class. Great visuals and descriptions for most of the topics.
